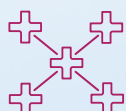

## Tackling Key Challenges in Sacramento

### BEHAVIORAL HEALTH

1 in 6 Californians<sup>1</sup> battle with behavioral health and are failed by a struggling infrastructure. Health Net believes integration of behavioral health is key to treating the whole person and improving health outcomes.

*Health Net in Action:* Health Net recently supported Sacramento County in the establishment of an **11-MEMBER WORKGROUP THAT BROUGHT INDUSTRY, COUNTY, COMMUNITY, AND PROVIDER STAKEHOLDERS TOGETHER TO DEVELOP** a universal Trauma-Informed Care Training program for all Sacramento County employees. Through this training, County employees will be better able to identify and respond to trauma in their interactions with the community at large.

### WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

Lawmakers<sup>2</sup> in Sacramento have deemed California to be in a health care workforce crisis. By addressing California's physician and health staff shortages<sup>3</sup>, Health Net is keeping its promise to reverse the growing gap of access to quality care.

*Health Net in Action:* A Health Net grant to the Los Rios Foundation initiated a collaborative partnership between Sacramento Community College, the Greater Sacramento Urban League and WellSpace Health. **THE COALITION KICKED OFF THE COMMUNITY HEALTH CARE WORKERS PROGRAM** creating a career pathway to engage students wishing to join the health workforce — **20+ STUDENTS HAVE ALREADY COMPLETED THE PROGRAM**, with more to enroll.

Health Net works with providers and policymakers throughout Sacramento to identify communities of need<sup>4</sup> and reduce inequities in access to care — creating tailored solutions to achieve greater health for all of our members.

*Health Net in Action:* Health Net partnered with the Sierra Health Foundation and the Black Child Legacy Campaign (BCLC) to establish the Cultural Broker Program. The grant created **A NETWORK OF BCLC PARTNERS AND COMMUNITY STAKEHOLDERS, PROVIDING CULTURALLY RELEVANT HEALTH CARE TO MOTHERS AND INFANTS**. Today, the program framework is helping other communities establish similar partnerships to reduce inequities in care for African American mothers and infants.
