Legislative Update	Sydney Turner (Director, Public Policy) provided an update on federal and state changes to the healthcare system, including eligibility and access requirements and coverage limitations for those who are undocumented or have an unsatisfactory immigration status. Additionally, she talked about the potential impact of these changes on Medi-Cal coverage and how the Plan is preparing to support members maintain coverage throughout the changes.		
Population Needs Assessment	Tarjani Padmani (Manager, Clinical Pharmacy Services) presented the Health Net Medi-Cal membership profile for 2024, showing demographic breakdowns and health needs. The top needs identified include meals, housing, and medical needs. Tarjani shared that Health Net connects members with community resources and promotes programs to address these needs. Additionally, she discussed the disease prevalence in Amador, Calaveras, Inyo, Mono, and Tuolumne Counties and the importance of early intervention and prevention programs.		

	Lastly, Ms. Padmani invited feedback from members about their experiences with Health Net's outreach and assistance.		
Health Literacy Overview	Armine Kelechian (Senior Health Equity Specialist) introduced the topic of health literacy and digital literacy. Health literacy involves the ability to find, understand, and use health information, while digital literacy involves using digital tools for health information. Health Net materials are required to be at a sixth grade reading level and culturally appropriate. The health equity team reviews and approves materials to ensure they meet these standards.		
Non-Specialty Mental Health Services (NSMHS)	Melen Vu (Program Manager III, System of Care) presented the Non-Specialty Mental Health Services (NSMHS) outreach and education plan submitted to DHCS. The plan includes recommendations from community partners and strategies to increase utilization of NSMHS and reduce stigma. The outreach includes social media/email campaigns, provider trainings, and other activities focused on behavioral health topics.		
Community Sharing/Open Forum	Committee members were invited to share items for Community Sharing/Open Forum. Members requested support. Meeting was adjourned at 1:30pm.
