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<p>SB 1019 / APL 24-XXX: Non-Specialty Mental Health Services: Member Outreach, Education, and Experience Requirements</p>	<p>Sydney Turner (Director, Public Policy) reviewed Senate Bill 1019, a new requirement that addresses the historic underutilization of Non-Specialty Mental Health Services (NSMHS) by ensuring Members and PCPs are aware of all covered NSMHS. Health Net requested the committee's feedback on the development and implementation of an annual outreach and education plan for Members and PCPs about covered NSMHS.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Committee expressed concerns over long wait times for mental health services and a need for clarity in the referral process. • Committee had suggestions for more inviting marketing and public imagery to encourage seeking help, i.e. the use of Member stories vs data and statistics. • They emphasized the need for trauma-informed care and sensitivity to multiple cultures. 	<p>N/A</p>	<p>N/A</p>
<p>Population Needs Assessment & Local SMART goal</p>	<p>Sydney Turner shared information on the new Population Needs Assessment, which is a collaboration with other plans and local health department to identify the priority needs of the community. Eliana Argueta (Regional Program Manager) shared San Joaquin and Stanislaus's SMART goals with the committee and requested feedback –</p> <p>San Joaquin: Pending finalization-- From January 2024-December 2025, San Joaquin County Local Health Department (LHD) and MCPs including Health Net will collaborate to improve depression screening for pregnant and postpartum members by 50%.</p> <p>Stanislaus: By December 2025, Stanislaus County and MCPs will work collaboratively to develop targeted interventions to improve childhood immunizations rate for those 2 years old and younger to exceed the DHCS benchmark 50th percentile.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Committee identified barriers such as lack of local vaccine access and transportation issues preventing families from accessing vaccines. Suggested mobile clinics or school-site vaccinations as solutions. • They emphasized the limited access to care in rural communities, advocating for 	<p>N/A</p>	<p>N/A</p>
