## **Los Angeles Wildfire Impact on Schools:**

Hazel Health provides telehealth services for more than 1.3 million students in Los Angeles County.

The following emergency services are available to students and families within any Hazel partner district in Los Angeles County, including the Los Angeles Unified School District and Pasadena Unified School District, impacted by wildfires.

You can access:

- Telehealth and telephone services
- Behavioral health and physical health services
- Family support services

If you have a child who attends a LAUSD school that opted-in for Hazel Health, you can access these services wherever you are.

## **Free Items:**

- **American Red Cross Los Angeles Region:** Offers immediate emergency assistance, including clothing, to disaster victims. Contact their 24-hour hotline at **(800) 675-5799**.
- **California Fire Foundation's Supplying Aid to Victims of Emergency (SAVE) Program:** Provides \$250 gift cards to eligible fire and natural disaster survivors for necessities like clothing. These are distributed on-scene by participating fire departments. For more information, visit their website.
- **Los Angeles County Department of Public Social Services (DPSS):** Offers disaster assistance programs that may include support for clothing needs. Reach out to the DPSS Customer Service Center at **(866) 613-3777** or visit their website.

- **211 LA County:** Provides referrals to various social services, including clothing assistance. Dial 2-1-1 or visit their website for more information.
- **FindHelp.org:** An online directory where you can search for clothing programs in Los Angeles. Visit their website and enter your ZIP code to find local resources.
- **Bobbie – Free Baby Formula,** an organic baby formula company, is **providing any parent affected by the fires** — Bobbie customer or not — with free baby formula. Fire victims can apply for the free formula at **Bobbie's online application**.

## Financial Aid and Support

If you have been affected by the recent wildfires, there are several financial aid resources available to help manage expenses and continue your education:

- **California Fire Foundation's Supplying Aid to Victims of Emergency (SAVE) Program:** Provides \$250 gift cards to eligible fire and natural disaster survivors for necessities like clothing. Distributed on-scene by participating fire departments.
- **California Community Foundation's Wildfire Recovery Fund:** Offers grants to support intermediate and long-term recovery efforts for wildfire-affected communities.

- **Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Assistance:**

Provides grants and loans for recovery after a disaster declaration, including housing repair or rental assistance.

- **FEMA Disaster Recovery Center**

Two FEMA Disaster Recovery Centers will be open in Los Angeles County to assist Californians who experienced damage to their primary home, personal property loss or have disaster-caused emergency needs related to the wildfires. At the center, people can get help applying for federal assistance, speak to representatives from state and federal agencies, receive updates on their FEMA application for assistance and learn about the appeals process.
