What is the difference between the two HMO plans? Are there benefit changes?

The primary differences between plans are their copay variations for certain services. Yes, there are benefit changes to both the High Option and Standard Option plans. See below:

Can I receive a printed directory?

What should I know about the two health plans offered by Health Net?

Deductible – Neither health plan we offer has a deductible. This means that whatever the copayment amount your plan shows for a covered benefit, that is the amount you will pay without having to satisfy a deductible before enjoying your benefits.

Out-of-pocket maximum (OOPM) – Both plans offered by Health Net have a cap on the amount a member will spend during the calendar year on the medical copayments/ coinsurance. This maximum is \$1,500/single and \$4,500/family. When a member has reached his or her maximum, all further medical copays are waived for the remainder of the year. It is important to note that prescription copayments do not apply to the OOPM. It is your responsibility to keep a record of the copayments and coinsurance that you have paid. At the point that you believe you have

satisfied the OOPM, contact Health Net's Customer Contact Center. We will request copies of your medical receipts, and, if you have satisfied the OOPM, we will make a notation to the providers that no further medical copayments or coinsurance are necessary for the balance of the year.
