

Clinical Policy: Balsalazide (Giazo)

Description

Balsalazide (Giazo[®]) is a locally acting aminosalicylate.

FDA Approved Indication(s)

Giazo is indicated for the treatment of mildly to moderately active ulcerative colitis in male patients 18 years of age and older.

Limitation(s) of use:

- Effectiveness in female patients was not demonstrated in clinical trials.
- Safety and effectiveness of Giazo beyond 8 weeks have not been established.

Policy/Criteria

Provider must submit documentation (such as office chart notes, lab results or other clinical information) supporting that member has met all approval criteria.

It is the policy of health plans affiliated with Centene Corporation[®] that Giazo is **medically necessary** when the following criteria are met:

I. Initial Approval Criteria

A. Ulcerative Colitis (must meet all):

1. Diagnosis of ulcerative colitis;
2. Failure of balsalazide at up to maximally indicated doses, unless clinically significant adverse effects are experienced;
3. Dose does not exceed 6.6 g (6 tablets) per day.

Approval duration: Length of Benefit

B. Other diagnoses/indications

1. Refer to the off-label use policy for the relevant line of business if diagnosis is NOT specifically listed under section III (Diagnoses/Indications for which coverage is NOT authorized): CP.CPA.09 for commercial.

II. Continued Therapy

A. Ulcerative Colitis (must meet all):

1. Currently receiving medication via Centene benefit or member has previously met initial approval criteria;
2. Member is responding positively to therapy;
3. If request is for a dose increase, new dose does not exceed 6.6 g (6 tablets) per day.

Approval duration: Length of Benefit

B. Other diagnoses/indications (must meet 1 or 2):

1. Currently receiving medication via Centene benefit and documentation supports positive response to therapy.
Approval duration: Duration of request or 12 months (whichever is less); or
2. Refer to the off-label use policy for the relevant line of business if diagnosis is NOT specifically listed under section III (Diagnoses/Indications for which coverage is NOT authorized): CP.CPA.09 for commercial.

III. Diagnoses/Indications for which coverage is NOT authorized:

- A. Non-FDA approved indications, which are not addressed in this policy, unless there is sufficient documentation of efficacy and safety according to the off label use policies – CP.CPA.09 for commercial or evidence of coverage documents.

Drug Name	Dosing Regimen	Dose Limit/ Maximum Dose
balsalazide (Colazal [®])	Three 750 mg capsules PO TID for up to 12 weeks	6.75 g per day

- With adjustment for multiplicity, statistically significant differences were seen in the male patients for clinical remission (35% with Giazio vs. 13% for placebo) and for mucosal healing (52% with Giazio vs. 20% for placebo). Effectiveness of Giazio was not demonstrated in the female subpopulation in the clinical trial.

Ulcerative colitis	Three 1.1 g tablets PO BID (6.6 g/day) with or without food for up to 8 weeks	6.6 g/day
